

New Year, New You

Level up your sleep hygiene

Let's adopt a fresh perspective on the importance of sleep for health. A change in my outlook was brought about by an unsettling experience last year. One night in October, I woke up from a nightmare at around 3 am. However, the frightening part was that while I had clearly woken up, my body remained paralyzed. For those who have never experienced this or those who have experienced it but don't know what it is, this is sleep paralysis. This harrowing phenomenon happens when the brain and body are out of sync while transitioning between sleep stages. It is quite common as studies show that most people experience sleep paralysis at least once. After three terrifying episodes in one week, I decided to do some research.

Looking into it further, I learned what exactly causes sleep paralysis. Our sleep cycles through multiple stages categorized as NREM (non-rapid eye movement) and REM (rapid eye movement). During REM sleep, the brain generates surprising or strange events in the form of dreams. To prevent us from physically acting out dreams, the brain paralyzes our muscles during this stage. Ideally, when we wake up, our muscles regain function.

However, sleep paralysis occurs when we

abruptly transition into or out of REM sleep, and our muscles remain paralyzed despite regaining consciousness. But why did this happen to me in the first place? It turns out poor sleep hygiene was the primary cause of my sleep paralysis episodes. It was that week in October (which I will always remember as the sleep paralysis week from this point on) - when I was getting scattered sleep due to multiple assignments and upcoming exams. This brings us to this article's main purpose; what exactly is sleep hygiene? Is it simply healthy sleep practices? Simply put, yes. But, when it comes to getting better sleep, the advice we often hear is to aim for 8 hours of sleep and get to bed early. Though well- meaning, this blanket guidance from family members overlooks the nuances of healthy sleep. Over the last century, research on sleep has mostly corroborated the first advice most of us do need around 7 to 9 hours of sleep, which makes 8 the average, the magic number. However, my question is: Is sleeping for 8 hours and sleeping early enough? Or even realistic, considering how busy our working/academic and social lives are? Assignments, exams, social events, binge-worthy shows, and engaging books can often end up keeping us up at night.

10-3-2-1

Therefore, I embarked on a small research journey to find some solutions for all of us. The 10-3-2-1 rule is considered to be the ideal way to maintain sleep hygiene - 10 hours before sleep, no caffeine; 3 hours before sleep, no food; 2 hours before sleep, no work; and 1 hour before sleep, no screen-time. But for most of us, this rule is not always possible to follow. That's why I've included some more flexible tips below to help improve sleep quality. Here you go:

Keep a consistent sleep schedule: Going to bed at the same time every day may be hard, but at least aim to wake up at the same time every day. I know it's tempting to wake up late during weekends, but an option could be to nap during the early afternoon to get some extra sleep.

Limit screen time: Try to limit screen time 30 minutes to 1 hour before you are planning to sleep. This is because the blue light emitted by the screen messes with our sleep cycle and makes the brain think it is daytime. If this is not possible during times of work - switch to night light on all the devices you are using to minimize exposure to blue light as much as possible.

Avoid caffeine and try chamomile tea: Most of us are coffee or tea addicts but attempt to limit caffeine consumption during the evening or night. Instead, drink chamomile tea. It tastes and smells amazing!

Establish a pre-sleep routine: Spend 15-20 minutes before sleeping doing light exercise, meditation, or even a simple skincare routine.

Listen to binaural beats (a pre-sleep routine option): Binaural beats are a form of soundwave therapy that encourage relaxation, and videos are easy enough to find on YouTube. Try listening to these for 15-20 minutes before bed.

Tired minds don't plan well. Sleep first, plan later

The key is to do these hacks in sequence as part of a consistent sleep routine. For example, 30 minutes before you plan to sleep, put away digital devices and begin sipping chamomile tea. Then listen to a 15-minute binaural beats audio while following a soothing pre-bed routine like skincare or meditation. Using these hacks together will compound their relaxing effects and signal to your mind and body that it is time to wind down for sleep. Establishing this structured sequence over time can have a powerful impact on improving sleep quality.

So, let's implement these new solutions for a new year, those that emphasize quality of sleep over quantity, and are easy enough for us busy individuals to incorporate into our daily routines. The goal is not perfect sleep but better sleep that promotes restful nights and helps prevent issues such as sleep paralysis. Happy sleeping!

The Evolution Of **Artificial Intelligence** In Cybersecurity: A New Frontier in It

Cyber Security is becoming a major worry for everyone in the modern digital age-individuals, companies and governments alike. The threat landscape is forever changing, and traditional Cyber Security methods are finding it difficult to keep up with the exponential growth of data. But in the battle against cyber threats, artificial intelligence (AI) has become a powerful ally.

The term artificial intelligence (AI) describes how computers, especially computer systems, may simulate human intelligence processes. Artificial intelligence (AI) is used in cybersecurity to improve threat detection, response, and mitigation techniques. This represents a dramatic change in Cyber Security strategies from reactive to proactive.

Threat detection is one of the main uses of Al in Cyber Security. Conventional signature-based detection techniques are useless against new or undiscovered assaults because they rely on the patterns of malicious code that are known to exist. On the other hand, Al-powered threat detection systems can instantly examine enormous volumes of data to spot unusual activity that might point to a possible cyber attack. These systems continuously enhance their detection skills by adapting to new data and

learning from it through machine learning algorithms.

Al is also transforming the field of malware classification and analysis. It is no longer possible to perform manual analysis due to the enormous number of malware variants developed every day. Al-driven malware analysis technologies make it possible for Cyber Security experts to react quickly to new threats by automatically analyzing and classifying malware based on its behavior, code structure and other characteristics. Al is also making major advancements in incident response and threat mitigation. By automatically coordinating and ranking security alerts, planning and coordinating response activities, and even containing or resolving security problems on their own, Al-powered security orchestration and automation solutions can optimize incident response workflows. This lessens the workload for human security analysts and speeds up response times, freeing them to work on more strategic projects. Furthermore, in Cyber Security Operations, Al

is being used more and more to supplement

human decision-making. Al technologies can

enable security analysts to make better

judgments and allocate resources more

effectively to solve the most significant

insights and suggestions based on historical data and real-time threat information. But even with their enormous promise. Al-powered Cyber Security solutions have drawbacks and restrictions. The possibility of adversarial attacks, in which malevolent actors take advantage of flaws in Al systems to avoid detection or alter system behavior, is one of the main worries. Research is still being done to create strong and resilient Al models that can withstand manipulation by adversaries to lessen this risk.

The application of Al in Cyber Security also raises ethical and privacy issues, particularly when it comes to the gathering and handling of sensitive personal data. To guarantee that Al technologies are applied ethically and


openly, companies must put in place the necessary safeguards and follow accepted ethical standards.

In conclusion, with its unmatched powers in threat detection, analysis, and response, artificial intelligence is set to completely change the Cyber Security scene.

Organizations may strengthen their defenses against changing cyberthreats and stay one step ahead of adversaries by using Al. But it is imperative to approach Al adoption in Cyber Security with care and responsibility keeping in mind the possible hazards and moral dilemmas that come with its application. 

Embarking on the journey of entrepreneurship is not for the faint-hearted. It's a path filled with challenges, sacrifices, and relentless perseverance. My story is of a self-funded entrepreneur who rose from humble beginnings to create multiple successful businesses. It aims to inspire and prove that with hard work and dedication,

anything is possible. BITVAN In the early days, my Hustle entrepreneurial spirit found its roots in the most unexpected

places. Armed with nothing but a dream and a few resources, I started by selling biryani not in a fancy restaurant or through a high-end delivery service, but in local bakeries and departmental stores. I would prepare and deliver biryani to bakeries, selling each portion like an egg puff. For every biryani sold, I paid the bakery owner Rs. 5. To promote my biryani, I put up posters in each bakery and even managed to secure orders from stores like Nilgiris, which would order a minimum of 50 portions every weekend.

I delivered biryani in a variety of vehicles from a Honda City to a Pulsar and even a TVS Excel. The mornings were especially busy. starting with newspaper inserts at 4 AM, distributing flyers in front of the HAL gate by

6 AM, and then coming back home to cut onions and prepare biryani by 7 AM. By 9 AM, I would send out SMS blasts offering a free kebab with every purchase of five biryanis. By 10 AM, I had sold around 300 portions, and I was off on my bike to attend to Axis leads from Just Dial, meeting up to 10 clients a day, covering at least 150 km. The journey didn't stop with biryani. My relentless drive led me to venture into multiple businesses simultaneously. I would The Rise finish my day delivering ice cream OI VIA stocks to 60 vendors in areas

Bommanahalli, often returning home very late. Managing multiple businesses required me to wear many hats. I was the boss and the flyer distributor, the helper, cook, driver, supplier, plate washer and server. During the early days of catering for TCS, I had to juggle various roles to ensure the business ran smoothly.

HAID like Whitefield, Indiranagar, and

Axis, my flagship venture, thrived because of this approach. By personally handling tasks that others might consider beneath them, I set an example for my employees. This approach instilled a sense of dedication and hard work in everyone involved.

The journey was not just about personal success; it was about uplifting others along the way. My team included 60 employees in the ice cream business, 30 in the biryani business, and 25 each in Axis and MSR. Each day, I carried 3 lakh rupees in cash, yet I was still willing to distribute flyers at 6 AM in front of HAL gates.

My philosophy was simple: when the boss is willing to get down to the ground level, it inspires everyone else to do the same. I motivated each vendor and employee to strive for better, ensuring they saved money and provided education for their children. This personal investment in their welfare paid off immensely. One of my ice cream vendors, who came to Bangalore with just Rs. 500 and no place to stay eventually became a manager and working partner, enrolling his son in an international school. The culmination of my efforts was Axis, which became the leading merchandise supplier for major colleges in Bangalore, including Christ, Joseph's, RV, and MCC, during the years 2009 and 2010. The ice cream push carts doubled as biryani vendors, selling 300 portions daily, and the vendors were incentivized with movie tickets for distributing flyers in front of colleges, making Axis a household name in college

merchandise.

Reflecting on this journey, the key takeaway is the importance of humility and hard work. No task is too small if it contributes to the bigger picture. The journey from selling biryani and distributing flyers to building a business empire is a testament to the fact that success is built on a foundation of grit and perseverance.

My story is meant to inspire the next generation of entrepreneurs. It's a reminder that with dedication, passion, and a willingness to do whatever it takes, you can turn even the most modest beginnings into a thriving business. Parents should encourage their children to dream big and pursue their passions, trusting that with hard work, they can achieve great things.

Axis, along with my other ventures, stands as a beacon of what is possible for any middle-class boy or girl with a dream. This journey proves that success is not just about where you start but how relentlessly you pursue your goals regardless of the challenges along the way.

Darkness falls under the starry night sky, and soon I am at the mountain creek, standing atop the highest peak, and it feels like I can fly.


I look down to my little hamlet, and so many others nearby, a beautiful sight at the horizon, sky's magnificent dark hued pallette.







State's top accolades such as the Rajiv Gandhi Khel Ratna Award, the Arjuna Award and the Ekalavaya Award. As on date, we have 9 students who have competed in past editions of the Olympics and 5 more who have qualified for the upcoming Paris Olympics, 2024.

The chief guest was Sreeshanth S and the guest list included Robin Uthappa, Pankaj Advani, Shikha Tandon and Anaita Nair. The fest had over 1,200 participants from more than 53 colleges across India and witnessed some of the country's best talent in the field of sports.

Khelo India University Games

We have competed in KHELO all editions of the Khelo India University Games since its inception bringing in glory consistently.

1st edition - 2020

JAIN (Deemed-to-be University) participated in 5 sports and won 25 medals, including 8 gold, 6 silver, and 2 bronze medals, and finished 7th in the overall medal tally.

2nd edition - 2021

We hosted the 2nd edition of the Khelo India games which saw 20 sports being played



with participation from 3,900 students from 210 universities across the country. JAIN (Deemed-to-be University), won the KIUG 2021 title with 20 gold, 7 silver, and 5 bronze medals, taking the overall medal tally to 32.

3rd edition - 2022

At the Khelo India Universities in 2022, our JAIN (Deemed-to-be University) team finished in third place, securing the overall championship in swimming with 13 gold, 8 silver, and 4 bronze medals; and an overall medal tally of 15 gold, 10 silver and 6 bronze.

4th edition - 2023
